- Ringing ahead to make sure there are no school or group visits which would make the Museum noisier than normal on 0118 937 3400 or through our [Enquiry Form](#)

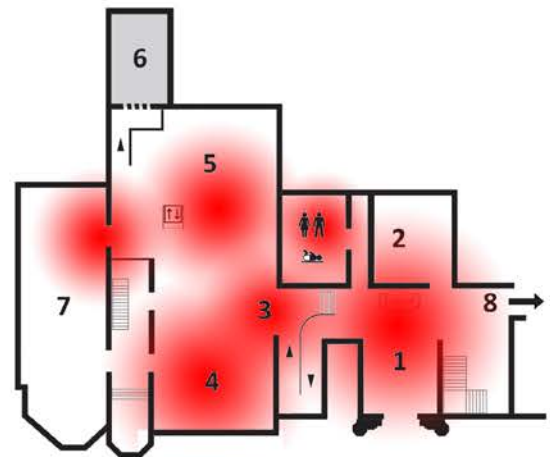
SOUND MAP

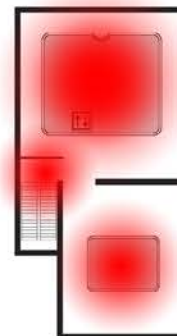

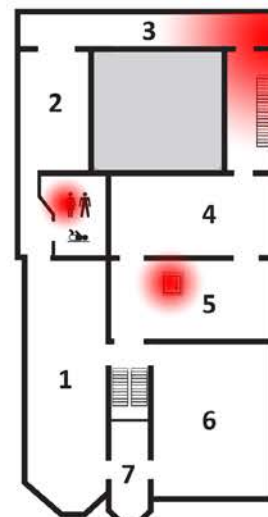

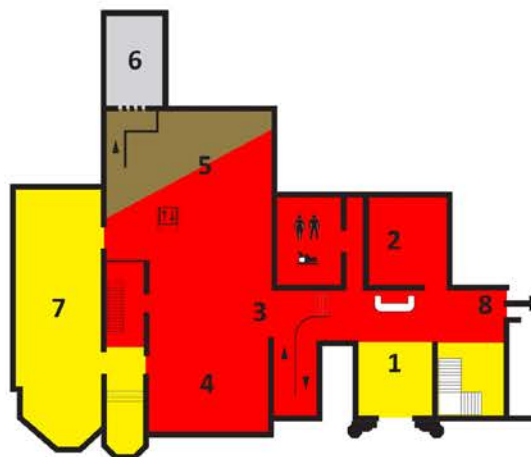


LIGHT MAP

Naturally lit areas of the Museum tend to be bright as well as being artificially lit.

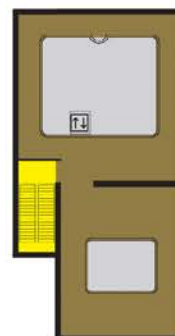
